SOLO CATEGORY (S)



S.1. SOLO SONG (HINDI)

Themes: The Voice of Youth Shaping Tomorrow

Sub-Junior (I-II) - Little Voices, Big Dreams (Action Song - Songs about young children imagining a better world, spreading hope, joy, and kindness through simple actions.)

Junior (III-V) - Growing Together for Change (Songs celebrating youth taking small actions for environmental care, promoting friendship, and harmony in communities)

Senior (VI-VIII) - Youth Empowering Tomorrow (Songs highlighting teens advocating social change, peace building, climate action, and standing up for what is right.)

Super Senior (IX-XII) - Echoes of Tomorrow: Youth Inspiring a New Dawn

(Powerful, motivational songs about youth leaders driving innovation, promoting peace, advancing climate justice, and inspiring collective progress for a brighter and more sustainable future.)

- ✓ Two entries from each school
- ✓ Use of Tanpura or Harmonium is permitted only by Self
- ✓ Dress code- White only (including Socks, Canvas/Shoes, etc), School Uniform is prohibited
- ✓ No embellishment of body or dress is permitted.
- ✓ Time-3 minutes, without warning bell
- ✓ Criteria for assessment-Voice, Melody, Rhythm and Intonation

S. 2. SOLO DANCE

Themes: The Voice of Youth Shaping Tomorrow

Sub-Junior (I-II) - Little Steps, Big Hopes

(Dance performances capturing how small efforts and pure intentions of children plant the seeds for a peaceful, joyful world.)

Junior (III-V) - Guardians of Green (Dances celebrating young people taking impactful actions for the environment, kindness to others, and harmony within communities.)

Senior (VI-VIII) - Movements of Change

(Performances showcasing teenagers as champions of social causes, unity, climate action, and role models in their spheres.)

Super Senior (IX-XII) - Choreographing Tomorrow: Youth Shaping Destiny - (Dynamic, expressive dances reflecting youth as visionary leaders in innovation, peace-building, environmental activism, and positive change on a larger scale.)

- ✓ Two entries from each school
- ✓ Songs biased to any particular religion or political party is not permitted
- ✓ Time duration: 4 Minutes without warning bell
- ✓ There should be no indecency in kind
- ✓ Fusion of songs is permitted
- ✓ Criteria for Assessment: Presentation, Steps, Costume and Expression

S.3. ELOCUTION (ENGLISH)

Themes: The Voice of Youth Shaping Tomorrow

Sub-junior (I-II) - Telling Tomorrow's Tales

(Short stories or imaginative speeches highlighting hope, kindness, and small good deeds dreamed by young minds.)

Junior (III-V) - My Country, My Responsibility

(Talks on artificial intelligence's role in solving global problems, promoting progress, and balancing technology with human empathy.)

Seniors (VI-VIII) - AI & Us: Intelligence for a Better World

(Speeches cantered on caring for the nation, environment, and unity-shared with pride and promise by young citizens.)

Super Seniors (IX-XII) -Tomorrow Speaks: Youth on the Rise: Extempore.

- ✓ Two Participants from each school
- ✓ Time: 3 Minutes without warning bell
- ✓ No Mic will be provided
- ✓ Dress Code: White only, School Uniform not permitted, No decoration on body or dress
- ✓ Criteria for Assessment: Dictation, Development of Theme, Content and Oratorical Skills

S.4. WATER COLOUR PAINTING

Themes: Imagination for a Sustainable Future

Sub-Junior (I-II) - Our Gentle Planet

(Paintings of domestic animals in happy, safe environments; care, gentleness, and protecting nature.)

Junior (III-V) - Young Eyes, Green Earth

(Nature-inspired art-trees, birds, rivers, landscapes-preserving and cherishing through a child's perspective.)

Senior (VI-VIII) - Monuments: Guardians of Heritage (Paintings of Indian monuments, showing cultural pride, resilience, and unity.)

Super Seniors (IX-XII)- Visions Unveiled: The Future Is Now (On-the-spot artwork with storytelling-themes of youth innovation, sustainability, peace, and harmony with nature. (any one will be given on the spot)

- ✓ Three Participants for each category from each school
- ✓ Time: 90 Minutes
- ✓ Class I and II can use crayons and others water colour only
- ✓ Participants are to bring their drawing materials
- ✓ Criteria for Assessment: Creativity, Originality, Artistic Composition and Thematic Clarity





GROUP CATEGORY (G)



G.1. GROUP SONG (HINDI)

Themes: Harmony for Tomorrow

Junior (I-V) - Little Patriots, Big Hearts

(Patriotic songs celebrating unity, national pride, and peaceful dreams of a rising generation.)

Senior (VI-XII) - Melodies of Progress: Tradition in Tune (Group songs blending cultural heritage, innovation, solidarity, and collective vision for progress.)

- ➤ One Entry from each school
- ➤ Number of Participants: Minimum 15, Maximum 20 (inclusive of the instrumentalists)
- > Dress Code: School uniform is prohibited, Costumes are allowed.
- ➤ Time: 5 Minutes
- ➤ No pre-recorded music or tracks
- ➤ Backdrop will be common for all groups, no props is allowed
- Sound assistance: 5 Mic for singers, two Mic and two aux jacks for musical instruments
- ➤ Criteria for assessment: Harmony, Rhythm < Melody and Presentation.

G.2. GROUP DANCE

Themes: Steps of Hope: Dancing Towards Unity

Junior (**I-V**) - Roots in Rhythm:

(Environment the master of dance, Semi-classical Dance inspired by Nature)

Senior (VI-XII) - Unity in Motion:

(Dances Across Borders Western Dance expressing unity and harmony among people of different nation.)

- > One entry from each school
- > Participants: Minimum 15, Maximum 20
- ➤ Time: 6 Minutes
- The song track must be handed over or mailed by 28th October, 2025.
- Songs based to any particular religion or political party is not permitted
- ➤ Prop/Dress Code: School Uniform is not permitted
- Criteria for assessment: Presentation, Choreography, Synchronization and Costume.







(Students from any category can participate in the following items)

O.1. INSTRUMENTAL MUSIC

Themes: Soundwaves of the Future: Youth Setting the Tempo (Young performers use instruments to express ambition, teamwork, and the power of new ideas-youth set tomorrow's rhythm.)

- ✓ One team from each school
- ✓ Participants: Minimum 7, Maximum 12
- ✓ All instruments are permitted, rhythm must not be played form the keyboard
- ✓ No instruments will be provided, bring own instruments
- ✓ Time: 10 Minutes (5 Min for arrangement and 5 Min for performance)
- ✓ Criteria for assessment: Presentation, Coordination, Rhythm and overall impression

O.2. TABLEAU

Themes: Youth Illuminate: From Shadows to Solutions (Tableaux show how youth transform moments of conflict into opportunities for healing, collaboration, and rebuilding.)

- ✓ One team from each school
- ✓ Time: 6 minutes
- ✓ Participants: minimum 15, Maximum 20
- ✓ No commentary is permitted
- ✓ Pre-fixing of any article before allotted time is strictly prohibited.
- ✓ Criteria for assessment: Presentation, Creativity, Relevance and Performance

O.3. Quiz

Theme – Environment (Youth - Emerging Environmentalist)

(The quiz encompasses the following: history, persons, movements, national/international issues, proponents, conflicting views, pollution, climate change, greenhouse effects, deforestation, biodiversity, carbon emissions, pro & anti-environmental activities and related themes)

- ✓ One team from each school
- ✓ Participants: 5
- ✓ There will be a selection based on a written test

- ✓ Top seven Schools will be selected for the final round
- ✓ There will be five rounds

GENERAL Guidelines

- The participants are expected to maintain an atmosphere of friendliness and spirit of brotherhood, with an attitude of openness, sincerity, honesty, and responsibility.
- Any kind of indiscipline, indecent behaviour, unbecoming gesture or activity, offensive language will be dealt with very seriously, and the concerned participant(s) / group(s) may be disqualified from the competitions and in case of offence being serious, the concerned party may be instantly sacked without any prior notice.
- The teachers accompanying their students will solely be responsible for the conduct of the students entrusted to their care.
- Arricipants should not tamper with any item or system: electric, electronic or any other in the classrooms or school premises. Any property damaged or vandalized should be made good by the participant or by the school the participant(s) belong(s) to.
- All students should be in their respective school groups during the leisure time.
- All the schools/contestants are expected to report at the venue by 8.30 a.m.
- No parents are allowed to accompany the students.
- Lunch and refreshments will be served to all the contestants and teachers.

Norms For Competitions

- Any kind of fire/smoke including *dhoop* in any competition is strictly prohibited.
- Introduction(s) of the participant(s) by self or others before the judges are strictly prohibited. Violation of this rule will lead to disqualification.
- We follow the "One Participant One Item" policy strictly, viz. if a participant participates in singing competition, he/she cannot participate in any other item in any category either Solo or Group or Open which would automatically lead to disqualification.
- ❖ Divulging the identity of one's school in any form by way of dress, actions, gestures, or any other hints by the concerned participants, teachers, school authorities either on or off stage, or before the judges during or prior to the performance of a school shall attract disqualification of the participants from the competition.
- No warning bell will be given during any competition except Tableau. Contestants/groups exceeding the time limit will suffer reduction of points/marks based on the number of seconds/minutes taken extra.
- Any group performing an Item with more or lesser participants than the prescribed number will be considered disqualified. It is advised that minimum and maximum number for every group item be noted well in advance.
- All the songs for dances should be mailed to the official email ID, mentioned below, latest by October 25, 2025.
- ❖ Every item of the competitions has its specific rules and regulations. Familiarizing oneself with the norms will benefit one and all.

Identity Card System

- ✓ The students and the accompanying teachers must wear the Identity Card issued to them by the Organizing Committee, failing which they may even be expelled from the campus without prior notice.
- ✓ Identity Card must be produced before on stage participation in any competition and whenever it is asked for. The Organizing Committee has the right to debar any participant(s) from taking part in any competitions for failing to produce the Identity Card.

Grievance Redressal

- Any complaints or suggestions in general or regarding any of the competitions are welcome. But the Organizing Committee will entertain only the written ones submitted by either a Principal / Sister or a Teacher-in-Charge of a concerned school or any other person nominated by the management of the school.
- Complaints, if any, are to be registered in the office of the Organizing Committee with a nominal registration fee of Rs. 100/-.
- In case of any dispute, the decision of the Arbitration Board will be final.

REGISTRATION

- The registration of the participants will be done through respective schools only.
- The schools should register the names of the contestants with the photocopy of their Identity Cards issued from the school along with the prescribed Registration Fee.
- The last date for registration is Saturday, October 25, 2025.
- The registration can be done by signing in www.agrarainbow.in with the User Id and password sent to the principal separately.
